



AROUND THE SCHOOL WITH MR PITT

3 Morrissey: Last week I visited **3 Morrissey**. The children were publishing their funny journal entries. I spent some walking around listening to the children read their work (the illustrations were pretty cool too!). After writing, 3M played a fun maths game called 'Claim It'. The children worked in two groups with Miss Mu Sung and Miss Michael. In 'Claim It' the children need to use their knowledge using all four number operations. The longer the game went, the harder it became. Thank you 3M, I enjoyed my visit to your classroom.



5/6 Jennings: Last Tuesday I had the pleasure of visiting **5/6 Jennings** during their green screen recordings. Just like 5/6M last fortnight, the children have been working in groups to research different scientists. From here, the students needed to write a script talking about their scientist and what they were famous for—we heard about Michael Farady, an English scientist and George Westinghouse, an American entrepreneur. The green screen was used to make it more exciting and engaging for the students. The students are currently selecting their green screen backgrounds, ready to showcase to the rest of Stage 3 later in the term.

SCHOOL SWIMMING & WATER SAFETY PROGRAM

During Weeks 3 and 4, 120 Fairvale students took part in the School Swimming and Water Safety Program, funded by the Department of Education. During the intensive sessions students focused on swimming skills and being safe in and around water—at pools, beaches, creeks etc. It was pleasing to sign the certificates to find that many students were able to swim unaided at varying distances. The most important thing for parents is to allow your students to practise what they can do over the summer period. I would also thank Miss Herps and Mr Carbone for accompanying the groups.

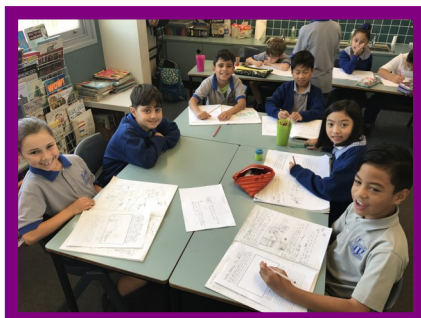

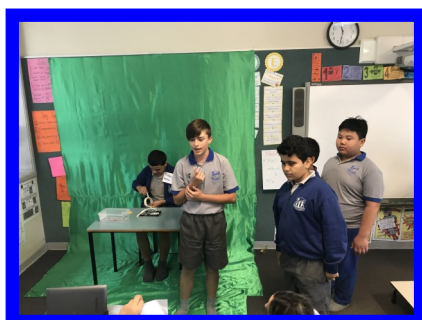

LANGUAGE LEARNING AND LITERACY (L3)

All of the Kindergarten teachers this year have participated in either their first or second year of L3 training. This intensive program focusses on the explicit teaching of talking, listening, reading and writing. The collection of student data drives the planning which ensures all students are provided with learning goals and teaching at their point of need. Student results have shown that this has been a successful program. Tuesday was the last day of training for the teachers this year. Well done to the teachers and students for their outstanding results!

CRICKET CLINICS

Last week students in K-3 participated in Milo Cup Cricket activities. The students had loads of fun practising their cricket skills and having a game. It is so important for children to develop skills to play a range of sporting games as well as fair play skills.

WORKING WITH CHILDREN TO SUPPORT THEIR NUMERACY DEVELOPMENT

- Help your child see how you use maths in everyday life. For example, explore how you use fractions in cooking; percentages while shopping; distance in driving; keeping score in sports games and telling the time.
- Encourage your child to practise the times tables and to solve simple maths problems in their head. Try asking them to:
 - work out how many pieces they will need to cut the birthday cake into so that everyone has a slice
 - work out the actual cost of discounted items (e.g. 25% off \$20)
 - figure out when you will arrive at a destination (e.g. "It is 4:15 pm now. It will take us 30 minutes to get home, what time will we arrive?")
- If your child is struggling to work it out, suggest they show you on paper or talk you through how they are trying to work it out so you can help them.
- Maths is a learned skill that improves with practise. Talk positively about maths and encourage your child to practise as much as possible as part of a regular routine.



Attendance Matters

"Must my child attend school sport?" - YES, Sport and other exercise help the healthy physical development of children. Sport is part of normal school activity which students must attend

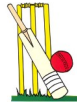

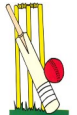

Friday, December 1st (Week 8). The Fair Rewards Day is **Tuesday, 5th December, 2017.**

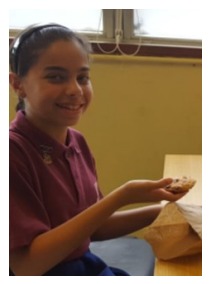

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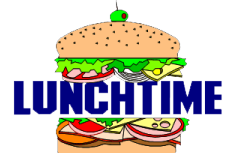
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High School Transition
