
WEEK 3

History: Step back in time

Science & Technology:

Did you know that sound travels? As sound travels, it gets slower, meaning it takes longer to reach something further away and less time to reach something closer. When sound is made, the invisible sound waves begin to slow down and become quieter as they travel.

We are going to be testing how sound travels.

Materials needed:

 Two steel bowls (or steel pots or pans).

Instructions:

- Step 1: One person stands holding two steel bowls.
 You stand close to the person. The person hits the bowls together with force.
 Listen to the sound they make.
- Step 2: Take 5 steps further away from where you were standing. The person hits the bowls together when signalled. Listen again to the sound they make.



Facts about Argentina

Argentina is a country in South America and is the secondlargest country in South America and the eighth-largest country in the world. The capital city if Buenos Aires.

Spanish is the language most people speak and the official language, but many other languages are spoken.

About 46 million people live in Argentina.

The flag of Argentina consists of three horizontal lanes. The white strip contains the national emblem called the May Sun. The blue colour in the flag represents the sky, while the white colour represents the clouds in the sky.





La Boca is a city in Argentina that is famous for its colourful houses. Originally, La Boca was a shipyard. The dock workers who lived there were so poor that they built their houses using cast-away ship building materials such as planks and corrugated sheet metal. ... But there wasn't enough paint of the same color to cover an entire house, so the houses became colorful patchwork.



Iguazu Falls

Iguazú Falls are located on the Iguazu River. between the borders of Argentina and Brazil. There are roughly 275 distinct falls, in the shape of a horseshoe, that make up Iguazú Falls, which is the largest waterfall system in the world. The word Iguazu simply means "big water". Most of the falls (around 80%) are on the Argentine side.

The most popular sport in Argentina is football (soccer), the Argentine national team has won the football World Cup twice in 1978 and 1986.

Soccer

Argentina has 2 world famous soccer players - Diego Maradona and Lionel

During a soccer game there can be up to 50,000 people in a stadium watching. The Argentinean National Soccer team is ranked eight in the world and represent the country in World Cup Soccer, the Olympics and in the South American Football League.

Food

Typical Argentine food consists of lots of meat. Argentine Beef is known worldwide for its full flavour and tenderness. Lunch is actually the largest meal of the whole day. Argentine people love their 'Asado' where food is typically prepared on a grill or over open fire as part of a barbecue (BBQ).



Empanadas: Deep-fried or baked stuffed pastry pockets with either a savoury (cheese, vegetable or minced chicken o beef meat)



Alfaiores: sweet biscuits filled with dulce de leche cream and rolled in shredded coconut shavings.

Dulce de Leche: literally mean sweet from milk. It is thick caramel which is used in lots o Argentinean desserts.





Culture – The Tango

The Tango is a dance which was created in Buenos Aires, Argentina. Argentine tango is danced in an embrace that can vary from very open, in which leader and follower connect at arm's length, to very closed, in which the connection is chest-to-chest, or anywhere in between.

Tango dance is essentially walking with a partner and the music. Dancing appropriately to the emotion and speed of a tango is extremely important to dancing tango. A good dancer is one who transmits a feeling of the music to the partner, leading them effectively throughout the dance. Also, dancers generally keep their feet close to the floor as they walk, the ankles and knees brushing as one leg passes the other.
